Pure Fitrah

When Abu Bakr was a youth, his father took him to a temple that was filled with idols. Pointing to the idols, his father said, "These are your gods." Abu Bakr, precociously intelligent as he was even then, decided to put the matter to the test; He approached an idol said, "I am hungry, so feed me." When the idol did not respond, he said to it, "I am naked, so attire me in clothing." When it did not respond again, he threw a stone at it and it fell down onto its face. Thus he came to realize—without the help and guidance of a Prophet or of revelation—that worshipping idols was and undignified and senseless thing to do.

Pure Fitrah

Before the Prophethood of Muhammad (و عليه الله صلى سلّم),
Abu Bakr heard Christians and those who spoke about monotheism, speak about the coming of a prophet.

Waraqah ibn Naufal, the paternal cousin of Khadijah الله رضي confirmed to Abu Bakr, based on his knowledge of the revealed books, that there was an awaited Prophet that had yet to come.

Pure Fitrah

"The best among you during the pre-Islamic days of ignorance are the best among you (now) in (their) Islam, if they develop an understanding (of the religion)."

"You are telling a lie," while Abu Bakr

(believed in me and) said to the people,

"He has said the truth,"

Abu Bakr As-Siddeeq was approximately 38 years old when he accepted Islam




The Da'wah of Abu Bakr As-Siddeeq



Abu Bakr As-Siddeeq was the <u>first</u>, after the Prophet (ستموعليه الله صلى) to deliver a public message calling people to Islam

As a result, he was savagely beaten and almost died



"Verily, with every difficulty there is relief."


After the incident in which Abu Bakr As-Siddeeq was almost killed, he asked the Prophet Muhammad (سلّمو عليه الله صلى) to supplicate for his mother, Umm al-Khair, which he did, and she became Muslim.

Narrated 'Urwa bin Az-Zubair: I asked Ibn 'Amr bin Al-'Aas, "Tell me of the worst thing which A/-Mushrikun did to the Prophet (SAW)." He said, "While the Prophet (SAW) was offering Salaah in the Hijr of the Ka'bah, 'Uqba bin Abi Mu'ait came and put his garment around the Prophet's neck and throttled him violently. Abu Bakr came and caught him by his shoulder and pushed him away from the Prophet (SAW) and said, "Would you kill a man just because he says, 'My [Bukhari 3856] Lord is Allah?"

After the Messenger of Allah (سلّمو عليه الله صلى), Abu Bakr As-Siddeeq was the first person to be harmed in the way of Allah.

He was the first person to defend the Messenger of Allah (سلّمو عليه الله صلى)

He was the first person to invite others to the way of Allah
